2. the cruiser Terek was berthed in front of the ordnance yard, where her gun armament was worked on. *

3. North of the town, in the Artillery Cove, a battleship and two cruisers were moored

On the battleship, a triple turret was seen forward and aft. The ships were manned by Soviet sailors and never had steam on or shifted berth throughout the period of observation.

4. On the "Day of the Black Sea", the heavy cruiser Molotov and a number of other vessels (which could not be clearly identified) were lying in the North Cove, west of the South Cove. These vessels were also occasionally observed executing maneuvers but they never went to the South Cove. On the same day seven Soviet submarines were tied up in front of the dockyard in the South Cove.
